

Engine Generator Technician

The Department of Water Management is seeking a skilled technician who has experience with generators and engines in an industrial setting. The purpose of this role is to maintain the emergency power equipment both standby and continuous duty engines for the water and waste water facilities in the greater Durham area serving 250,000 citizens . The incumbent maintains the mechanical, electrical, hydraulic, and pneumatic equipment which controls or operates the above. This is accomplished by operational testing, oversight of preventative maintenance and repairs, and purchasing replacement parts. Other duties include reviewing specifications for new engines or generator systems, updating used equipment to meet technology requirements, and inspecting equipment for quality. May be required to be on 24-hour call.

- Associate's Degree related to mechanical or electrical fields
- Principles, practices, tools, and techniques required for the operation and maintenance of dual-fueled engines and generators and apparatuses
- Minimum 3 years experience in operation and maintenance of large industrial engines (dual-fuel desirable) and generator systems (up to 500 kW); or any equivalent combination of training and experience
- Valid Class "C" Driver's License; CDL preferred
- Use and care of tools and equipment of the mechanical and electrical trades
