DSC History

Entering its eleventh year as a lacrosse league, and seventh as a fully sanctioned NCAA Division II conference, the **Deep South Conference** is committed to excellence in the sport of lacrosse.

The Deep South Conference was formed in the summer of 1997 with six charter members in North and South Carolina. The league consists of Catawba College (Salisbury, NC); Lees-McRae College (Banner Elk, NC); Limestone College (Gaffney, SC); Mars Hill (Mars Hill, NC); Pfeiffer University (Misenheimer, NC); St. Andrews College (Laurinburg, NC); and Wingate University (Wingate, NC).

The original Deep South League began play in 1994 with Catawba, Greensboro, Limestone, Pfeiffer, and Virginia Tech. In 1995, St. Andrews College was admitted to the DSL before losing Greensboro in 1995 and Virginia Tech the following season.

In 1997, the league grew to accommodate the additions of Wingate and Lees-McRae. With six teams, the Deep South League held its inaugural postseason tournament, in which Pfeiffer stood victorious.

In 1998, Mars Hill College (Mars Hill, NC) entered the Deep South Conference, increasing its membership to seven teams.

In 2000, Limestone won the NCAA Division II national championship. The Saints won the national title again in 2002, while advancing to the national championship game in 2001 and 2003.

Queens University in Charlotte, NC, was added as the league's eighth member in the summer of 2003.

Today, the Deep South Conference, the premier lacrosse league in the South, is dedicated to the highest quality of competition and sportsmanship.

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

Catawba posted its best season in school history in 2003, going 7-7 and advancing to the semifinals of the Deep South Conference Tournament. Only three starters return from that squad, which lost six its top seven scorers and a top defender.

Goalie Frank Fish heads the list of returning players. The two-year starter posted an 11.51 goals against average last year and had a save percentage of 59.5 percent. The leading returning scorer is Jason Windett. The sophomore had 13 goals and 11 assists in his freshman season.

In the midfield, seniors John Godfrey and David Dunnuck return. Godfrey was the team's top face-off man, winning 70 percent (129-of-184) of his opportunities. He also had five goals and 75 ground balls. Dunnuck produced seven goals. Senior Mike Mueller will return to anchor the defense. He had 34 ground balls and 17 take-aways last season.

The key losses for Catawba include All-DSC middie Josh Maphis, who led the team with 35 goals and 22 assists last year and will serve as an assistant coach this year. The No. 2 and 3 scorers, Chris Khatri (23 goals, 16 asst) and Jeremy Knapp (22 goals, 8 asst) were also lost to graduation. The defense will also miss the services of All-DSC performer David Donohue, who had five goals, 89 ground balls and 53 take-aways last year.

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

Coach Perkinson returns a very good team from last year. With the balance of the new freshman this should be Lees-McRae best team to date. This team is unlike the former Bobcat team has depth and experience. They are hoping to improve on their first conference win last season.

At the attack is where the Bobcats will be most youthful. This year they will be led by sophomore Madison Thompson (Riverside, NC) who will look to improve on his numbers from last season. Joining Madison is Jr. Nik Nixon (The Woodlands, TX) and So. Dan Barry (Miami Palmetto, FL). These three make a triple threat for the Bobcats with good speed and finishing capabilities. Freshman Chris Stieber (Myers Park, NC) will look to add some size on this unit.

At the midfield Lees-McRae is fast and rangy. Led by Co Captain Josh Spriggs (Downingtown, PA) and Co Captain Jason Walker (Atholton, MD) the Bobcats have eight middies that can really play. Michael Swearingen (Mount Vernon, VA) won 57 percent of his face-offs last year and look to improve on that stat. Brian Voight (North Carroll, MD) returns as a Jr. to continue on his steady point consistency. Joining this group of returners are three very talented freshman, Tyler Stieber (Myers Park, NC), Zack Spriggs (Downingtown, PA) and B.J. Lamb (C. Milton Wright, MD) who will look to blend with the others to help Lees-McRae this season. Also Lees-McRae returns their top defensive midfielder in Jordan Peters (North Carroll, MD) who is one tough kid to beat to the goal.

Once again the strength of the Bobcats is in their defense. They are led in the net by Sr. Co Captain Chris Fielder (Harford Tech, MD) who posted some great numbers last year and Sr. Co Captain Adam Roberts (Riverside, NC). Both are great leaders on and off the field and will only continue to improve the Lees-McRae defense. Joining them are returners Zack Dabkowski (North Carroll, MD) and Brad Dunn (Herndon, VA). These guys have played together for years and should be fun to watch. Waiting in the wings for their chances are Fr. Goalie Kyle Harter (Whitesboro, NY) and Fr. Defenseman Casey Grandelli (Upper Darby, PA), these two just bring more balance and depth to the unit. At LSM So. Ben McCauley (Westminster, MD) will take the reigns as the Bobcats fastest Long stick defender. He will be joined by two solid freshman in James Micciche (Albemarle, VA) and Jon Biden (Hargrave Military Academy, MD)

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

The Saints have put together five consecutive Deep South Conference Championships and four straight trips to the NCAA Division II National Championship Game. Although the team has said goodbye to several key players from the 2003 squad, the 2004 Saints will take the field as strong as ever with a tremendous returning core of players and an outstanding recruiting class.

The 2004 Saints will miss the play and leadership of Devan Spilker, Matt Malloy, and Damon Woolford, whose careers included four straight appearances in the National Finals and two NCAA Division II National Championships. Spilker was a four-time All-Conference selection at attack in the Deep South. He was also a two-time USILA All-American who holds the Limestone College career records for points (293) and assists (134). Malloy was a four-year starter in goal and a three-time All-Conference performer. Last season he earned Deep South Player of the Year honors. In his career at Limestone he earned USILA 2nd-Team All-American honors as a junior and senior and was selected for honorable mention honors as a sophomore. Woolford served as the squad's top short stick defensive midfielder last season, and his on-field leadership will be sorely missed.

While these losses were large, the Saints will return seven All-Conference players and four All-Americans from the 2003 squad. Nick DeLonga, Nolan Heavenor, Nick Kobakof, Clint Pitts, Jason Randolph, Bobby Woody, and David Wooster all earned All-Conference honors for their performance in 2003. DeLonga, Heavenor, Pitts, and Randolph were also selected as USILA All-Americans. The Saints have also brought in an outstanding recruiting class including prep-school standouts Cory Dion, Matt O'Neil, and Brett Wanner as well as junior college transfer Josh Waite. Dion was a standout athlete in lacrosse and football at Kimball Union Academy in Old Saybrook, CT. He was a two-time First-Team NNEll All-Star and three-time Lake Region All-Star selection in lacrosse as well as an All-New England selection in football. O'Neil was an All-State performer in Michigan. Wanner was a two-time All-State selection in Ohio. He was named the Ohio Player of the Year as well as a High School All-American for his performance that led Dublin Scioto to the State Championship. Waite is a junior transfer student out of Herkimer County Junior College. He earned 1st-Team All-American honors at Herkimer County while leading his team to the Junior College National Championship in 2003.

The Saints will feature an attack unit that really began to mesh during the fall season and has the potential to once again be one of the top offensive units in Division II. The unit will be led by Jason Randolph, David Wooster, and John Navarro. Randolph, a senior from Arnold, MD, was an honorable mention All-American and 1st-Team All-Conference selection last season. He will be the leader of the Saints offensive unit and is a strong candidate for Attackman of the Year in Division II. Wooster earned Second-Team All-Conference honors in his first collegiate season. Navarro has an uncanny ability to get open inside and possesses great stick work.

Head Coach T.W. Johnson feels that the Saints midfield is perhaps the deepest and most athletic unit he has seen in his tenure at Limestone. Junior Nolan Heavenor was an honorable mention All-American and First-Team All-Conference player in 2003. Junior Bobby Woody, a Second-Team All-Conference selection last year, will look to become a greater scoring threat this season. Senior Chris Barrett will play a large roll in the Saints' face-off unit. Junior Jesse Buppert was still recovering from a torn ACL last season. He worked hard over the off-season and has returned stronger than he has ever been. Josh Waite is one of the fastest athletes on the squad. The junior midfielder can handle the stick and will provide added depth in face-offs. Brad Patridge may have the quickest lateral movement on the team which makes him a great dodger. Junior Kyle Zentz had back surgery over the summer and has returned stronger than he was in 2003. Brett Wanner, Chris Wolf, and Seamus Rhodes will also compete for time at midfield. Nick DeLonga and Harley Beekman will carry most of the face-off load. DeLonga is a two-time All-American and should once again be one of the best in Division II in face-off situations.

Defensively the Saints will be led by two seniors, Nick Kobakof and Clint Pitts. Kobakof is a two-time All-Conference selection who possesses excellent stick handling ability and a tremendous understanding of opposing offenses. Pitts was a Second-Team All-American in 2003 and could emerge as a candidate for NCAA Division II Defenseman of the Year in 2004. Sophomore, Sean McQuin will also be a key defender for the Saints. After a solid freshman campaign, look for McQuin to have a breakout year. Freshman Cory Dion could be a pleasant surprise for the Saints in 2004. An outstanding athlete, Dion has adjusted well to the college game during the fall and should have an immediate impact as a freshman.

At long stick the Saints are led by two young but very talented athletes. Travis Bitter started for the Saints as a freshman in 2003 and is one of the most skilled stick handling long sticks in Division II lacrosse. Red-shirt freshman, Mike Freudiger will provide depth and talent at the long stick position as well. Freudiger is a very hard worker who is always around the ball.

In goal the Saints will miss the play and leadership of four-year starter and 2003 Deep South Player of the Year, Matt Malloy. Fortunately the Saints have plenty of talent to fill the void. Freshman, Marty Ward is a great communicator in goal. Red-shirt freshman Charlie Gray is a pure stopper with extremely quick hands. Sophomore Ryan Demorest communicates well and has a solid outlet, and junior Ben Crosser has returned healthy this fall after an injury plagued career. These athletes are all extremely talented and will give the Saints great depth in goal for several years to come.

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

The Mars Hill College Lacrosse Program will enter the 2004 season with a new look, new attitude and new coach. Brian Anken becomes the fourth coach in the program's history after being the head assistant coach and defensive coordinator at Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) in Rochester New York. Making an immediate impression as one of the most aggressive recruiters in Division II, Anken looks forward to the opportunity to build a nationally recognized Lacrosse Program at Mars Hill College.

The Lions showed a rejuvenated level of excitement and optimism after finishing the program's most successful fall season, which was highlighted with convincing victories over The University of Tennessee, and Deep South Conference rival Lees McRae College.

After coming off an 0-12 campaign in 2003, the Lions will be looking to their core group of 11 returning players including six starters to take on leadership roles this season. Included in this talented group of returnees is second year captain and two year leading scorer Sean Humphreys. In addition to Humphreys, the Lions defense will be anchored by potentially the best goalie duo in the conference, that includes the 2002 DSC Freshman of the Year, Chris Kingston and sophomore standout Matt Holthaus.

The Lions have made two important additions to the program this season including standout freshman defenseman Devin O'Neill from Bel Air High School in Maryland, and freshman of the year candidate, Andrew Chapman who will be playing attack for the Lions after a successful career playing junior level "A" lacrosse for the Toronto Beaches in Canada.

Humphreys will once again lead the Lions' attack unit this season. After finishing the 2003 season with 23 goals and seven assists, Humphreys will be expected to be a major contributor on offense once again. Completing this year's potent group of attackmen include freshman Andrew Chapman and senior captain Connor Jardeleza, a big, powerful scoring threat who finished the 2003 season as a midfielder with four goals and a assist.

The midfield will be led by last season's second leading scorer, Jack Riggins, with 12 goals and seven assists and the fourth leading scorer David Woodlief with seven goals and nine assists. In addition to the offensive threat this unit brings, it will be built around the aggressive two way midfielders including senior Dan Sandlin, junior Chris Bugbee and sophomore faceoff specialist Chance LeBron.

After losing All-American defenseman Brian Davis and career ground ball leader Richard Carrington, the Lions defense is young but filled with potential. Led by one of the most aggressive players on the team, James Phelan will be expected to fill the void left by Davis and Carrington. James is an emotional leader who is fully committed to the success of the program. Freshman standout Devin O'Neill and junior Dusty Poore help round out a very quick and tenacious defensive unit.

The Lions defense will once again be anchored by potentially the best goalie duo in the conference, which includes the 2002 DSC Freshman of the Year Chris Kingston (JR) and sophomore standout Matt Holthaus, who set the team record for most saves in a single game last year (38 vs. Catawba College). Both Kingston and Holthaus had very successful fall seasons and are expected to compete for the starting position this spring.

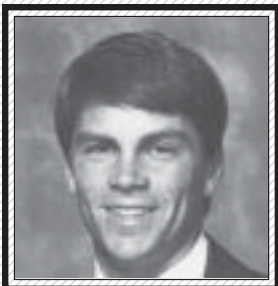

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

The team returns a strong group of players for the 2004 campaign, made up of seven return starters, fourteen letterman, a former All-American, and All-Conference and Preseason All-Americans. While injuries hurt the Falcon's last year with two starters sitting out most of the season, the Falcons look to rebound from their 2-10 record and will play a top ranked schedule again; facing four teams ranked in the top ten.

On attack, Erik Kostek (JR West Seneca, NY 9G, 5A) had a season shortened by injury, competing in only six games; he will be the anchor of the attack. Joining Erik is the quick Trevor Krauss (Jr Owings, MD 17G, 6A) and newcomers Robert Bickerstaff (Fr Maitland, FL, Winter Park HS) and Ryan Chandler (Fr Woodbridge HS, Woodbridge, VA).

Brian and Eugene will be joined by Mike Courteau, Jeremy Fenton and freshman Neil Bonestell (Fr. Raleigh, NC) and Andrew Aldred (Fr. Orlando, FL).

Defense will be the Falcons strength this year. Returnee Brian "BJ" Mauck (Sr. Fairfax, VA) is a second team all Deep South Conference selection from last years campaign. Rounding out the base defense is James Cowley (Jr. Bridgewater-Raritan, NJ), Dave Wharton (Sr. Fairfax, VA) a 2002 Defensive Honorable Mention DII All American and Jon Alcorn (So. Urbana HS, MD).

The Goalie position has not seen much change. Pfeiffer is loaded between the pipes with three returners from last year. All three goalies are pushing for time and could start at any point. Trevor Smith (Sr. Horseheads, NY) has received pre-season honors from Face-Off magazine, which placed him on the Honorable Mention All-American list for the 2004 season. Brian Palmer (Jr. Wooster HS, OH) has been selected as a team captain this year and is pushing for some serious playing time. Matt Porter (Sr. Baltimore, MD) is coming off a great fall season and is ready to display his talents in goal.

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

Andrew Delamielleure (Durham, N.C.), David Overberg (Cincinnati, Ohio), Michael Ragazzo (Carrboro, N.C.), Marc Lang (Cincinnati, Ohio) and Nathan Plassman (Upper Arlington, Ohio) all look forward to plenty of time on the lacrosse field.

Directing the Royals' attack will be Alex Tack (Ellicott City, Md.), Owen Ham (Durham, N.C.), Joshua Bryce (Woodbridge, Va.) and Mark Phillips (Cincinnati, Ohio).

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

With an outstanding group of seniors, a seasoned core of veterans and their largest freshman class to date the 2004 Knights could have an outstanding year ahead of them. The Knights look to improve on a 4-9 overall and 3-3 Deep South Conference record from last year.

Preseason All-American, Jimmy Herberson, returns to lead St. Andrews offensively. In 2003, Herberson was a second team DSC pick. He was also second on the team in scoring, registering 20 goals and 13 assists for 33 points on the season.

"Having Jimmy back will be a key to our success," says Brubaker. "He has the ability to be a dominating player in Division II and gives us the scoring punch that we need to win big games."

Joining him on the offensive attack will be sophomore Zach Mryncza and freshman Dalen Crouse. Mryncza, the team's 2003 Rookie of the Year, is second among returning players in points as he tallied 13 goals and 12 assists last season. Crouse comes to the Knights after an outstanding prep career in Alberta, Canada where he notched 31 goals and 22 assists. Senior John Becker and rookies Drew Howell and Derek Altmann will push for playing time.

The midfield will be an area of great depth for the Knights this spring. Senior leader Sean Jurecic will anchor a midfield unit that will feature sophomores Pat Fitzgerald and Kyle Weiher. Jurecic will be expected to play a more offensive role as a senior. According to Brubaker, "Sean was one of our most versatile midfielders last season and we have great expectations for him in 2004." Fitzgerald ranks third among returnees in offensive production as he scored nine goals and dished out 3 assists in 2003. Weiher will assume most of the face off responsibilities for the Knights.

Ray Gayhardt and Chris Stott will lead the other rookies in the midfield. Gayhardt notched 9 goals and 2 assists as well as serving as a clutch face off man in tight games for the Knights. Stott should have a break out season this year after a quiet rookie campaign in 2003. Gayhardt and Stott will lead midfield lines with rookies Tom Watt, Dan Hartzell and freshmen Carter and Kohl Smith. Sophomore Kris Hartzell, who was among the top defenders in the league in 2003, will lead the defensive middies.

While most of the face offs will be taken by Kyle Weiher, there are six other face off men on the Knights roster. "Kyle has the ability to take over games at the face-off X," says Brubaker. Flexibility in mixing up the face-off men will enhance the Knights success. Expect to see Mryncza, Hartzell, Watt, Gayhardt and Kohl Smith all in the mix at the faceoff X as well.

Anchoring the defense will be sophomore leader Bryan Riddell. In 2003, Riddell played in ten games and dominated the opposition as a rookie. Fellow leader junior Jamie Tippett and freshman Peter Swink will join Riddell. Tippett is a leader on and off the field, a two-time junior college Academic All-American at Howard Community College, he will be counted on to play both close defense and share long stick duties. Jared Hess, Tony Davis and Dan Dupree will all push to work into the defensive rotation.

There will be a four-way race to see who earns the start between the pipes in 2004. Senior Kevin Woods, a two year starter will be pushed by fellow senior Sean Jaramillo, junior college transfer Chris Sherman and freshmen Jon Marrese. Jaramillo saw action in seven games and posted eighteen saves while allowing eighteen goals. Sherman is coming off an impressive season at Harford Community College and could push for time right away. Marrese is off to an impressive start in the field game after a stellar prep career as a box lacrosse goalie in Canada.

2004 SEASON OUTLOOK

Wingate University lacrosse enters the Sonny Ziegler era, as the University of Maryland graduate is the new head coach for the Bulldogs. Ziegler replaces John Dodd, who retired following the 2003 season. Dodd was the founder of Wingate University lacrosse.

An assistant with the Bulldogs last year, Ziegler is adjusting nicely to his new role. "On the field, I feel very comfortable," Ziegler said. "We purposely tried to keep most of the same terminology we used last year so it wouldn't be a big deal for the players."

The terminology is working, as the Bulldogs completed the 2003 season 8-7 overall and 5-1 in the Deep South Conference. Wingate finished second during the DSC regular season and advanced to the DSC championship game. NCAA Division II playoff qualifier Limestone College topped Wingate in the DSC title game.

Three of Wingate's losses came to teams that qualified for the 2003 playoffs: Limestone (twice) and national champion New York Institute of Technology. Wingate's road to the 2004 playoffs starts with New York Tech. The Bulldogs will face NYIT February 21 at the Disney Wide World of Sports complex in Orlando, Fla.

Ziegler believes Wingate has the personnel to challenge the Deep South Conference championship and a berth in the NCAA Division II playoffs. Wingate senior attack Steve Maxwell is a preseason All-American. Maxwell had team-best totals of 31 goals and 35 assists in 2003. "Steve is a great leader," Ziegler said. "He came back (for his senior year) in very good shape. Steve has worked very hard in pre-season practice."

One newcomer and one returning player will man the other two starting attack positions. Junior Travis Rimert is a walk-on who has been very impressive in pre-season drills. "Travis is probably the hardest working player we have on the team," Ziegler said. "He has made such a big jump in his play from the first day of fall until now."

Junior Matt DiMartino returns after a one-year absence. "Matt does a nice job finding space inside and finishing when we get him the ball," Ziegler said. Junior Julio Diaz-Jane returns with much experience. Diaz-Jane will provide depth to the Wingate attack.

Freshmen Josh Hatchell and Andrew D'Arcy will also see time at attack. Ziegler says as Hatchell and D'Arcy develop and get accustomed to the speed of the college game, their playing time will increase.

Ziegler feels the midfield will be Wingate's strength this season. The first midfield line will include senior Blake Taylor and sophomores Ryan Aloisio and Chris Manwaring. Taylor is a preseason All-American who has earned many accolades during his career. He is a two-time All-DSC tournament selection who earned All-DSC honors during the 2003 campaign.

"Taylor, Aloisio and Manwaring are doing a very good job for us offensively and defensively," Ziegler said. Taylor had 17 goals and 10 assists in 2003. He is a candidate for Academic All-America honors in 2004.

Aloisio had six goals and three assists in 2003, while Manwaring had four goals and one assist. Manwaring and Taylor will also see time at attack to help with Wingate's depth.

The second group of midfielders is Matt Plumer, John Martin and Paul Duggan. A junior, Plumer brings much experience and maturity to the table. A sophomore, Martin moves to his natural position of midfielder after playing long-stick midfield in 2003. A redshirt freshman, Duggan has a year of practice under his belt. He worked hard in 2003. He should be ready to make a contribution this spring.

Four freshmen will also see playing time in the midfield. Zach Ritter will see playing time on both lines. "Zach is very athletic," Ziegler said. "He is going to be a great player for us." Nate Torok will be taking many face-offs for the Bulldogs. He will also help defensively and in clearing situations. Inman Campbell has impressed the coaching staff with his athletic ability. Kevin McQuade joined the team in January and is quickly making the adjustment to college lacrosse.

Ziegler believes the Bulldogs have three "very good long-stick midfielders." Graduate student Greg Watterson earned All-Deep South Conference honors in 2002 but missed the 2003 season with a shoulder injury. He is a three-year captain for the Bulldogs. "Greg provides us with a great deal of leadership and ability," Ziegler said.

Freshmen Robert Cotton and John Elsalam did a good job learning the long-stick midfield position in the fall, Ziegler noted. They should both see quality minutes as first-year players.

On defense, two senior starters return. Pat Nyikes is another outstanding student who will contend for both athletic and academic honors this year. "Pat is a very strong leader on the field," Ziegler said. Adam Griffin was Wingate's first defensive substitute in 2003.

The competition is fierce for the third spot on the defense. Ziegler believes freshman Zac Winder has the advantage. Fellow freshman Graham Gill will make a contribution before the season is over. Redshirt freshman Jim Garnham and freshman Tim Traynham are both fighting for the spot of crease defenseman.

Junior Sean McCarty is a two-year letterman that will give the Bulldogs another veteran on defense. Freshmen Kyle Olson and Shawn Tranquist will battle for playing time on defense as well.

Senior goalkeeper Jonathan Cofer will be the starter after serving as a part-time starter the last three seasons. "Jonathan is a very solid stopper," Ziegler said. "He is excellent at clearing the ball. He has worked very hard at his ability to run the defense."

Freshman goalkeeper Alex Woods made a big switch when he moved to netminder. Ziegler believes Woods has "become a very good stopper. He only needs to work on his ball handling skills and his clearing ability."

Ziegler has high hopes for the 2004 Bulldogs. "I think the biggest challenge for the team is understanding and stepping up to the expectations that are being placed on them," he said. "We are asking them to do so much right now. I believe we are ready for the challenge."

Ziegler admits the team must start the season better this year. Wingate began the 2003 season 0-4 overall, but finished the year with eight wins in 11 tries. "We have a tough schedule," Ziegler noted. "We have been talking about getting out of the gates better this year."

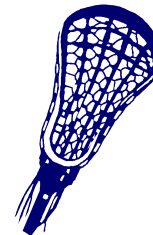

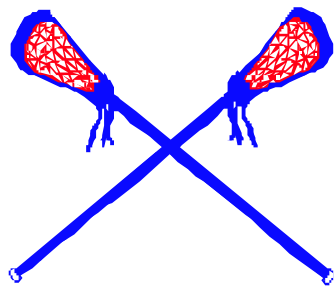
